
In the nearly twenty years I have been practicing law, I have, as you can imagine, met and been acquainted with a large number of inmates in our correction system. I can honestly say that Mr. Stump has impressed me as an individual who stands out as wanting a much better life if he were given the opportunity to be released on parole. Mr. Stump's attitude is outstanding, and I believe he has a deep and sincere appreciation of how he came to be in his current situation of incarceration, as well as a true understanding of what he would need to do to stay out of trouble in the future, if given the opportunity.

Mr. Stump's family is 100% in support of him and would do whatever is necessary to help him to reintegrate into society if he was released on parole. Mr. Stump's mother, although living in the state of Texas, has made frequent trips to Oklahoma to visit her son at his various places of incarceration. His step-father is one of his biggest supporters whom I have come to know both professional and as a friend. I can truly say he is a man of conviction of character, who would do anything he could to keep Mr. Stump on the straight and narrow.

If Mr. Stump was paroled to the state of Texas, his family has assured me that they would provide not only for his immediate needs clothes food and housing, but also that they have arranged for employment upon his release and return to Texas.

I humbly request that you give serious consideration to advancing Mr. Stump to stage 2 on your parole docket next month, so that you might have a chance to meet Mr. Stump in person, and to give further consideration for his request for parole.
